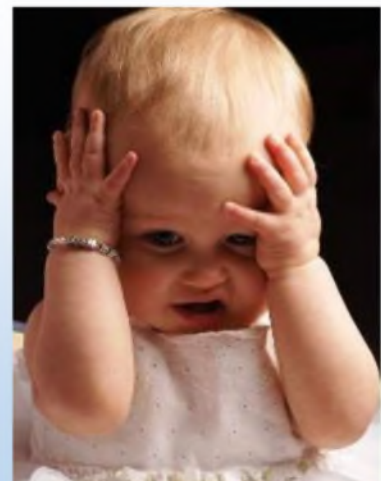

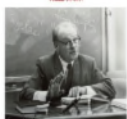

The team has taken on these concerns and are focusing addressing them while we wait for the new person to take over.
